Any other business:

Gillian Brennan to speak on construction of roundabout on the corner of Ellsmore Road and Erith Street. Currently WSC plans for a roundabout included in unfunded projects. Council suggested Gillian take to BCA. Increase in traffic movement will be occurring with extra doctor, dentist, pre-school. President recommended this go to committee for discussion. Ralph Clark suggested approaching Councillors on Traffic Committee. Determine what is the priority for 18/19 to get onto the budget papers.

GREEN TEAM REPORT AUGUST 2017

Ongoing maintenance has been undertaken at the garden beds at the information bay and arboretum at the northern end of the village, Picnic Park opposite the shops, and Belleveue Park and the gateway beds at the south end of the village. The current daffodil display makes a picturesque entrance to the village, although there have been some problems with anti social elements of the community picking the daffodils. In a recent interview with Graham Day on 2ST Laurel Hones mentioned this issue and he undertook to assist if possible. We would encourage any residents witnessing this behaviour to photograph the perpetrators and they can be displayed on the community section of the 2ST website.

In previous years a number of camellia groves were planted in suitable spots along Railway Avenue. Most of the trees are now thriving and will provide a very pleasant addition to the village entrance in future years. Maintenance of the annuals in the wine barrels located in the main shopping area is also a regular task.

Planning for the embankment has been stalled for some time due to changes in ownership of the quarry as well as some changes in Council policy and declining physical resources of the Green Team. It has been decided that due to advancing age and smaller numbers it is now beyond the capacity of the Green Team to continue maintenance of the embankment opposite the hotel and it is recommended that BCA write to Council requesting a formal takeover of responsibility by Council. Green Team members would remain available to assist with minor maintenance tasks but this would be under Council direction.

A detailed plan for the area has been drawn up with planting recommendations to reduce long term maintenance. It involves denser planting of some acacia and lomandra species as well as heavier mulching in some areas and this has already been discussed with Council officers.
