- h) Hall safety: as part of our lease of the Hall, the BCA is responsible for ensuring that all users understand and can manage risks that using the Hall can present. Of concern are the tables which need to have locking sleeves in place to ensure the legs cannot collapse. Other concerns are boiling water in urns, a heavy projection screen, access to the AV loft, electrical equipment, glass, potential trip hazards and a commercial kitchen. Over the next few months, we will create the safe work method statements to describe safe operation of these and other activities and then ask each Hall User (BCA subcommittees and Hiring Groups) to update their risk assessment for their use of the Hall. This is a critical activity to protect all users and attendees and an important component of good risk governance.

Bundanoon Swimming Pool – BCA made a submission to Council on their regional sporting facilities discussion paper. We noted that the Bundanoon precinct has a very good range of facilities and that the pool is an integral part of the precinct. We asked that there be consultation and the cost of the pool if needed, should be considered as part of the long-term contribution of Council to the Bundanoon and Southern Villages community.

The best news this year for the Bundanoon Solders' Memorial Hall is - we have a new roof!

This new roof is waterproof and fully insulated so many groups will now discover in the winter months they won't need the heaters on as much as before. And in the hotter months we will be expecting the Hall to remain much cooler. Before we were all sitting in a 'tin roofed shed' as far as insulation was concerned.

Bookings are coming in very regularly and so we are needing to be aware of Subcommittee's use of the Hall in 'prime' hiring time as outside hirers payments help with the running cost of the Hall. As current Hall Booking Volunteer and Hall Convenor, I am conscious of the importance of the Hall use for our BCA events and therefore always happy to reach compromises between other hirers of the Hall and our BCA hirers.

I am continuing to streamline our storage cupboards and to help the regular users of the Hall have some storage space for their equipment and props. We are looking at more shelving in the trolley cupboard and making better use of some "out of the way" cupboards for storing records that are valuable history to the Hall.

A new coat of floor polish has lifted the floor though we will be getting a quote for the complete cutback of the floor as there are now prominent scratches that the polish can't remove.

For safety's sake there is now a light plastic chain across both table cupboards reminding volunteers to be aware of securing the table legs correctly.

I again thank the Hall Willing Workers for their checking and maintaining the regular needs of the Hall such as filling up tissues in the toilets, removing rubbish, to the odd tidying up of the Hall after events.

The Hall is well loved and cared for, and it shows.
