 - a) Business arising from the previous meeting minutes and correspondence (if any)
 - a. External stairs advice from Council is that only 50% of funding is available to repair and make safe stairs. We have written to Council asking for urgent funds release in the next "quarterly review".
 - b. Loft safer access in progress
 - c. Steet parking/picnic park convenor is in discussions with Council. Disabled parking spot identified as outside Morton Café.
 - d. Request for improved medical facilities in Bundanoon. Acute tertiary clinical services are provided at tertiary hospitals in Area Health Service. There is a process of triage and escalation at each intervention point. If patients are dissatisfied with their standard of care, there is a complaints process.
 - b) Loan of Artwork Catherine Hanes entered and displayed a collage artwork titled "Under the Wings" in the Winterfest Art Competition. We asked Catherine if the BCA could display the artwork in the Hall as it symbolises themes that are close to the BCA – Belonging, Place and Home. Catherine kindly agreed and the artwork will be displayed in the Supper Room on permanent loan along with her Artist's Statement on the work.
 - c) Bundanoon Heritage Station: The Bundanoon History Group and Transport for NSW's Heritage Arm have been working on a project to provide an enhancement to the Station. The BCA have also been involved in the project. There will a presentation and information session at the next History Group meeting on

Monday 13 November at 10:30 am in the Hall. Please come along to learn more about what is a wonderful initiative for Heritage and Tourism. All are welcome.

- d) Readiness Expo Saturday 18 November 10 am to 1 pm: call for volunteers we need volunteers to: "meet and greet", accept post-event feedback forms, demonstrate, and encourage others to try CPR on our manikin, demonstrate and encourage snake bandage application on manikins. You do not need to be an expert to do CPR nor apply a bandage. The CPR manikin has feedback lights to let you know once you are doing it "right". And both have the potential to save a life. We will provide demonstration training. Please see the volunteer sheets at the sign on table at the Thursday BCA meeting.
- e) Christmas celebrations: Planning continuing hoping for "open precinct" to include Pool, barefoot bowls, and tennis tryouts. Entry will be free.
- f) Drop in Heritage and Transport Strategy: Council's planners are holding a drop-in session this Thursday 19 September (meeting day) in the Supper Room between 1 pm to 5 pm. This is very disappointing to the BCA as we applied for and received a grant for the late Queen's Jubilee celebration and memorial. We have reported this to NSW Police and will determine the best way to replace the trees. Each tree was around \$300 as they were advanced saplings.

President's Report 19 October 2023

October has been and continues to be a busy month.

I am delighted we have three new Committee members to bring the Committee up to eight. I am concerned that in March the current Office Bearers will have run their terms. There is a strong Committee and I hope some members feel inspired to contribute to the Association. Our Constitution does not allow an Office Bearer to hold a position for more than three years. I have indicated I am willing to stand as Treasurer to provide continuity to the systems and back-end processes that keep everything running smoothly.

The theft of two of the Jubilee memorial trees is disappointing as it is a theft of a community asset and to extend, a theft of the volunteering efforts that are made. The Green Team also reported the loss of two newly planted trees up near the Information Bay. Theft in a community, from a community, diminishes us all, most of all the thief – whether a resident of visitor.

Visitors – potential committee members – due to a number of vacancies, Genevieve Grayson, Siobhan Flattery and Andrew Rennie attended the Committee meeting as observers. All three indicated their willingness to join the Committee and the Committee endorsed their positions as casual vacancies.
