- (b) The committee proposes the update of membership and record keeping processes to allow for electronic management.
- (c) The committee proposes the change of terms for office bearers:
 - a. Committee Executives, being President, Treasurer, Secretary and Vice-President shall have an increase in term from 1 year to 3 years.
 - b. Committee Executives will be limited to holding positions for no more than 2 consecutive terms, being a total of 6 years. Currently, limited to three one year terms.
 - c. All other conditions and requirements to hold Committee Executive positions as voted by members remains the same.

There may be other amendments – each will be a special resolution.

Bundanoon Community Association – President’s Report (March 2025 – March 2026)

The past twelve months have once again demonstrated the strength of community spirit in Bundanoon and the vital role the Bundanoon Community Association (BCA) plays in supporting, connecting and celebrating our village. The Association continues to act as both a practical support organisation and a forum for community leadership, advocacy and collaboration.

Throughout the year BCA has continued its tradition of supporting local organisations and initiatives that contribute to the social fabric of our town. Financial and practical assistance has been provided to groups including the **Bundanoon Rebels**, **Bundanoon Swim Club**, and **Quest for Life**, as well as support for the **Bundanoon Pipe Band** and other community activities that enrich village life.

In addition to providing support Bundanoon Portrait Prize and the Bundanoon Feast of Freedom, the BCA also delivered **Christmas in Bundanoon**, including the planning and delivery of **Carols by Candlelight**, bringing residents together in a festive celebration at the end of the year. We worked through out the year with our Sub-Committees to look at how the BCA can better support their aims and ambitions and where investment need to be made to ensure continued support and impact for the community.

These events remain an important opportunity for our community to gather, celebrate and strengthen connections.

The Association has also continued to progress a number of strategic projects during the year. Work has advanced on improvements to the **Bundanoon Information Bay signage**, designed to better showcase local businesses and attractions, and discussions have continued with Council and community partners on matters such as **Picnic Park**, **Bundanoon Pool**, and broader community infrastructure initiatives.

None of this work would be possible without the dedication of the many volunteers who contribute their time and energy to the BCA’s **sub-committees**. From the Jordan’s Crossing Gazette, Arts Bundanoon, Needles and Natter and the Garden Ramble, through to Our Place Bundanoon and the Soldiers’ Memorial Hall, each group contributes enormously to the vibrancy and wellbeing of our village. On behalf of the Committee I extend our sincere thanks to all convenors and volunteers for their remarkable work and commitment.

I would also like to acknowledge the contributions of several Committee members who have stepped down during the year. **Geoff McCubbin**, **Lisa Sweeney** and **Dean Carey** have each given generously of their time, wisdom and community spirit. Their service to

6. Convenor Updates

6.1 Burns Night – Bundanoon Pipe Band – Trevor Wright

Our Pipe Band has gained two new drummers recently, Fiona (world champion tenor drummer) on snare and Brendan on bass. Brendan also plays drum kit but not in the pipe band!

We are very grateful for the BCA providing new snare drum cases, golden bagpipe cords and bag covers and snare drum harnesses. These items will greatly enhance the appearance of the band's uniforms in time for Brigadoon.

Despite most of the band being otherwise occupied during the Christmas holiday season we managed some rehearsals for January 25th Burns supper. This event was thoroughly enjoyed by the 100 guests at the hotel judging by the many positive feedbacks. The event was much improved on last year's(despite the 30 deg temperature) due to many aspects including:-

Improved sound system This made the poetry readings more listened to -thank you David from Illawarra Sound

30 fewer guests - making the serving of the excellent meal much more efficient

Introduction of "Chieftain for the Night" amply rewarded with a bottle of single malt (provide by the band)

Introduction of the coaster toss (our Pipe Major's idea) This allowed the hotel staff to clear away dishes etc much more quickly, got most of the guests outside in the cool night air and raised a lot of money for the BCA! Thank you to John and Tanya for supervising.

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Better raffle prizes organised by Donna Andrews. Apart from one bottle of single malt provide by the band all the prizes were donated. Many thanks to Bundanoon Pioneer bottle shop, Maggie New, Tim (surname), Brigadoon Committee ,AXE Thai restaurant.

Introduction of a bagpipe playing competition organised by Andrew Hearn

The small group who looks after the embankment are back at work after a short break over Christmas/ New Year. The new plants are going very well and starting to fill up the bare patches; however this land is quite challenging due to its slope and traffic right on the edge of the work areas.

At the end of last year we finished up with our working bees spreading some much needed mulch on two gardens along Penrose Road. ie. Belle View Park and the 'Bundanoon' sign at the entrance to the village.

Our main Working Bees will start up again on the second Tuesday of February at the Information Bay with some 'gentle' weeding!

6.3 Our Place Bundanoon - Geoff Pollard

Our Place Bundanoon

The Bundanoon Village Place Plan is being developed through collaboration between Community and Council to (hopefully) create a shared vision that guides achievable and positive change

Slower progress than planned with Round 2 Community Engagement held on 18th November, 2025. Al table was near the Mobile Library for the morning and in the SMH 3-5:30pm. Round 2 was also open for online comments 1-30 November on the “Participate Project Page”. I hope everyone who had input made the effort.

The drop-in sessions highlighted an ideas pack to show what ideas were taking shape and to ask for suggestion what is needed and what is missing from the Plan. Community

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attendance was small but steady and Council Staff were impressed with the number of new(ish) ideas suggested. I say newish because the pool had already been well-canvassed but was excluded from the ideas pack. A few other takeouts for inclusion were:

- The Vision Statement did not identify what the unique character of our Village is
- The Southern Highlands Wildlife Sanctuary needed inclusion
- A link to the Morton National Park was missing
- There was promotion of our State Heritage-listed Railway Station
- Traffic calming brought to be brought to the fore more
- Eco-Tourism support and preserving our rural nature needed higher ranking
- The document is a Council-centric Plan with community connectivity, including BCA, not mentioned

What next? The Council is hoping to exhibit the Draft Plan in the middle of the year and to sign off by the end of 2026. The Our Place Bundanoon Sub-Committee will 'gear up' in March, to be ready to engage as required. In the meantime the Team have created a new map of the Village that will be displayed on the Information Bay signage and also for the Bundanoon Discovery Rambles, including a new (7th) walk added.

I also wanted to mention Huw Kingston is going to take a look at the possibility of installing Destination EV charger in the Village. This is 'embryonic' and is a data-gathering piece of work at present.

Information Bay Signage

We are nearing completion! This is a 'slow burn' project due the number of businesses and community group involved. We were ready in December but a number of entities important to the Village were changing hands, so we have waited for that to stabilise.

Following BCA Committee review/signoff we hope to signs installed in March, prior to the BCA AGM.

In parallel we have been working on a new website to host the business/community QR codes and other links being included on the signs. This is currently in beta testing and I think you will be impressed.

Our interim thankyou:

- Ian Town for undertaking the massive amount of day-to-day work to bring this project to completion
- Peter McDonald for sage advice and undertaking the job of proofing/printing 1.5m x 1.5m of longed panels.
- Andy Carnahan for website guidance and other sage IT advice.

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We will mount a working bee to undertake the installation in the near future- let me know if you have some expertise and would be available.

Platform 3 Picnic Park

You may recall we spent a lot of 2025 enabling the Council to take up a License for the Park, and then agreeing on an MOU to confirm what Council would do for the Park and what process BCA would need to undertake to undertake the list of improvements identified from the Community Survey a couple of years ago.

That took us to September last year when the Picnic Park Sub-Committee re-started. We reviewed the site plan, met with various Council folk where we agreed on an approval process, sought and received a 'price estimate' to undertake the works so we knew what it might cost.

This number was well outside any budget we may have so we went back to the drawing board- literally, with Tim Charles joining the Team, and produced various options for consideration. As an aside, a quote from one of the Team is "Tim's drawings are awesome, easy to read and incredibly detailed". Thanks Tim.

We have now firmed up the site plan and feel we can undertake the works at a much lower cost.

Life is complicated however and Council needed to be brought back into the mix. As the Licensee they have a responsibility to ensure a safe environment for the Community. You may have noticed the significant under pruning of the Acer Negundo (maple) next to the Old Goods Shed? This as a result of highlighting our concerns about the tree and access to the bus shelter, etc. So in December we wrote to Council to highlight a raft of safety issues at the park- trip and head impact hazards and the lack of solar access, to see what Council will take off our list of improvements we want to make to the Park. This was also followed up with "SnapSendSolve" requests.

We are currently waiting for any Council response as to what they will remedy, before we re-scope/re-price and eventually undertake the works.. Thanks to Lions Club for 'hanging in there WRT a possible funding contribution.

One more aspect is the planned 'wombat' pedestrian crossing (slightly raised crossing to cater for B double trucks, etc), planned for Railway Avenue. BCA have been discussing this for several years and we now know the crossing has been designed and that it will come to us for Community Consultation in the near future. Please have your say as its final location will affect what we do in the Park. Hence improvements to the Park from the Old Goods Shed to about the first rose bed are 'on hold'.

Bundanoon Portrait Prize

Convenor thanked members and BCA for support. 37 entries have been selected for the competition. Additional category added for up and coming. Convenor requested members to attend exhibition during period to vote for “people’s vote”.

Darnita Phelan updated the members on the event on the 07th March in support of the Asylum Seeker Centre. Only 40 tickets remain available for what is expected to be an exceptional event.

New Convenor thanked Lisa Bonavia for her leadership. Advised that there will be a mid-year concert on the 27th June – Bundanoon, mostly, Swings! Convenor also advised of a Choir Fest event coming in October and to watch for further details.

Choir is seeking an accompanist on the piano and requests members to let him know if anyone is available.
