A Bundanoon Backdrop

Bundanoon Community Association (BCA)

The Southern Highlands is the traditional land of the Gundungurra nation. Prior to European settlement, the Gundungurra people had inhabited the area for many thousands of years. The Wingecarribee and Wollondilly Rivers were the focus of the lives of these people and also their ancient dreaming stories. They were largely undisturbed by European settlement until 1817 when the Europeans came through the area, leading to the ultimate loss of their lands.

Explorers are now on record as having been in the area near what is now Bundanoon as early as 1798. However, the earliest records we have on the Bundanoon locality are from 1838.

The original settlers in the 1860s were followed by those who came to work on the railway from 1868 and in the mines and quarries during the 1870s - 1890s. Known as Jordan's Crossing until 1881, Bundanoon supplied sandstone for railway track ballast, bridges and culverts; indeed, many of the fine sandstone buildings in Sydney are constructed from Bundanoon sandstone. Bundanoon also supplied timber for sleepers and coal to fuel the steam engines.

Many visitors found Bundanoon an ideal place for a holiday home, but soon chose to live here permanently. Tourism has always had a strong place in the life of the town.

Between the wars, Bundanoon was so popular as a holiday and honeymoon destination that it boasted 64 guest houses.

Today, with a mixture of old and new, with both village and rural lifestyles, Bundanoon still has much to offer visitors as well as those who call it home.

Bundanoon on Tap



Around 2006, the owners of a property within the town precinct of Bundanoon wanted to commercialise extraction of 50 million litres of water annually from their bore. Concern about the impact this would have on town life and the environment saw residents of Bundanoon galvanised into action. And then the question was asked – if we are blocking the taking of water for single-use bottled water production should we be selling commercialised single-use bottled water?

On July 8^{th} , 2009 the town voted 355 to 1 to 'go bottled water free' – a worldwide media storm erupted.

On September 26th, 2009 the last bottles of 'still' bottled water were removed from the retail shelves of Bundanoon.

To this day, you cannot purchase single-use bottled water in Bundanoon.

The village recently celebrated ten years since that decision was made with a very successful Bundanoon on Earth Festival and a celebration on September 26th recollecting that day ten years ago.

We asked the children at the Bundanoon Public School to share with us their thoughts and how we might 'do our bit for the environment' in pictures and words.

- o bottled water means you have to make plastic and plastic kills the animals and destroys the environment. *Hannah, aged 8*
- o you have to make plastic and plastic does not break down. Sienna, aged 9
- o the plastic can go down the drain and the animals can die. *Millie, aged 8*
- o Bundanoon stopped selling bottled water to help make the world a better place. *Ollie, aged 8*
- o our environment must be the first priority. *Hunter, aged 11*

Many other towns and villages and businesses and institutions around the world followed the decision made in Bundanoon in 2009.

Members of the Bundanoon on Tap sub-committee work with the community to discuss and consider other ideas to protect the environment in as many ways as possible.

The Bundanoon Garden Ramble

Held in late October each year, the Bundanoon Garden Ramble is a showcase of gardens in Bundanoon and surrounds.

In 2019 'ramblers' were treated to gardens ranging from a park-like show stopper of 5 acres with an enviable vegetable garden to a town block, carefully and cleverly worked to highlight both the original parts and new features.

Every year gardens are chosen that offer diversity in design, size and plantings showcasing the love and interpretation given them by the owners. The owners are always keen to share their love of gardening and the Southern Highlands. The dedicated garden owners spend months (actually years) prior to the weekend preparing their beautiful gardens in anticipation of the many visitors.

Visits to the beautiful gardens aren't all that is on offer in Bundanoon in Ramble weekend. There is the Garden Market in the Bundanoon Hall where plants, gifts and art can be purchased. The working display of old farm equipment in the main street is always popular and the Bundanoon History Group mounts an informative exhibition in the Old Goods Shed beside the railway line.

Garden Ramble also hosts a Lions Club scarecrow competition, with traditional and imaginative scarecrows popping up around the village.

There are free shuttle buses to visit the gardens. Those who would prefer it can use bicycles or their own transport to avoid delays. Each ticket is a brochure, which outlines each garden's detail, distances and any difficulties in or around each of the gardens. The brochure also contains a map of the area, positioning all the gardens.

The Garden Ramble is organised by a dedicated sub-committee and is one of the main fund-raisers of the Bundanoon Community Association. On the day, the Ramble relies on many volunteers to assist with ticket sales, enquiries, being at information points, bus drivers and more. Formed over 16 years ago, the Green Team is a sub-committee of the Bundanoon Community Association. Green team volunteers have transformed many of Bundanoon's public open spaces. Mass plantings of daffodils are a highlight of the Information Bay at the northern end of our village and Bellevue Park at the southern end. Overgrown areas have been cleared along Erith St & Railway Ave and Picnic Park (in the main street) is being upgraded.

Above all, we have fun and form some lasting friendships in the process.

Green teamers get together for about eight substantial working bees annually, plus a number of smaller activities, such as seasonal spraying. The working bees are usually held on a Tuesday morning and a newsletter prior to the working bee advises of the tasks being undertaken and the tools to bring. There is usually a range of tasks to suit everyone.

Every session ends with refreshments, providing the perfect opportunity to get to know other residents. The sessions aren't long and you will always be assured of a very warm welcome.

It's not necessary to attend all working bees. Come when you can and be part of a sociable and productive group helping to make our village a better place.

Leaver Park Group

Prior to the building of the Bundanoon Community Pool in the 1960s, Leaver Park, along with some beautiful water holes in the Morton National Park and other local bush areas, were the main swimming opportunities for residents of Bundanoon and nearby villages.

When the pool was built, local swimmers flocked to Erith Street to experience this new swimming opportunity. With virtually no activity there, Leaver Park slowly deteriorated, and the natural bush and some invasive non-native plant life increasingly filled the space.

The Bundanoon History Group has a significant number of pictures of this area prior to the 1960s (which can be seen at the Goods Shed in Railway Ave) and the work that continues on rejuvenating Leaver Park aims to make it a place to go to again. It is a beautiful natural area, very close to the village.

The work to date includes collecting over 10 cubic metres of dumped rubbish (and we are very pleased additional rubbish has not been dumped), weed, plant and wildlife mapping and considerable work on removing invasive plant growth.

In addition, Council has begun the significant work involved in removing the pine trees that have grown over the years. This involves first checking any habitat that is evident in the trees, then removing the branches and finally felling the tree with minimal impact on the area.

Council bush regeneration team has been very supportive and helpful in guiding the members of our sub-group to work beside them on the second Thursday of each month (February to December) on clearing up the undergrowth and preparing for meandering soft surface walks and an un-obtrusive picnic area.

You can visit Leaver Park by turning from Quarry Road into Leaver Park Road. Look out for the Council sign on the right about 1km along.

Christmastime is of particular joy to our community. The Variety Show, produced by Melting Pot just before Christmas, is a night of comedy, music and much laughter. We invite all members of the community to join in and show off their talents.

During the year Melting Pot runs several workshops, giving everyone the opportunity to hone their skills in whatever area they choose. We are very fortunate to have within our group several professional and very talented artists who are happy to share their knowledge.



BUNDANOON'S REX CINEMA

Bundanoon's finest and longest running cinema house.

The Rex Cinema is a 'pop up' cinema that regularly takes over the local Soldiers' Memorial Hall in Bundanoon. The cinema is run by The Rex Cinema committee, a Sub-Committee of the Bundanoon Community Association.

History of The Rex Cinema:

It all started in 1924 in a Bundanoon that had around 520 people and no mains electricity. Silent movies were screened using carbon arc projectors and a portable generator at Tylers Hall adjacent to the Hotel.

After the construction of the Soldiers' Memorial Hall in 1934, the Rex Cinema made the Memorial Hall its new home. However, the advent of television in the 1960s brought about the demise of many cinemas around Australia, including The Rex.

In 1994 a group of volunteers massaged the old projectors back into life, and the Rex Cinema was reborn. For 20 years we used the carbon arc projectors, and while scratchy picture quality and unpredictable breakdowns added to the nostalgia of the nights, the range of titles available on celluloid film was diminishing. The convenience and performance of modern technology led our committee to favour the DVD technology we currently use.

The Rex Cinema screens approximately six films each year. The film selection covers a mix of genres, including golden oldies, foreign language films, modern classics, and family favourites.

Tickets are only \$10 adults; \$5 children; \$25 family

Bundanoon Soldiers' Memorial Hall

The foundation stone for the Soldiers' Memorial Hall was laid in October 1934. On 22nd February 1935, a Grand Ball was held to officially open the Hall and unveil the Honour Rolls on the walls either side of the stage.

One ongoing use of the Hall since it was built has been the presentation of concerts of all types. Visiting artists and local audiences all appreciate the wonderful acoustics. Since July 2016, the Bundanoon Community Association has been the proud owner of a Yamaha grand piano, replacing



the older Kawai grand piano, which means we now attract some of the finest pianists in Australia to perform in 'our Hall' as part of the Arts Bundanoon program.

Over the years, however, the Hall has been used by the community for many other public and private events: photos here show some of the various uses, including markets, theatre productions, debutante balls, meetings, weddings, funerals, parties, dinners.



Seating is available for 200 in theatre style or 120 around tables seating eight people in comfort. The smaller Supper Room may also be hired for meetings. It seats 30-40.

There is a commercial grade kitchen and all catering crockery/glassware/cutlery/etc may be hired as well.

The Hall is leased from Council by the BCA and is managed by a sub-group calling the Hall Willing

Workers. The team looks after bookings, does daily maintenance/cleaning checks and arranges for maintenance.

Winterfest is Bundanoon's week-long celebration of the season, timed to coincide with the first week of the winter school holidays. It's one of the Bundanoon Community Association's major annual events. On the first Saturday of the holidays we kick-off with the opening night street party. We close Railway Avenue to traffic, from Osborne Street up to Anzac Parade, from 5pm until 9.30pm, and fill the street with stalls selling a range of food and drink, including the Bundanoon Lions Club's delicious mulled wine. BUNDANOON RURAL FIRE BRIGADE - RFS

In 1939, a loose-knit group of volunteers formed a Bush Fire Brigade after a devastating bush fire passed through Bundanoon destroying twelve houses. The alarm bell was outside the Police Station, and leather beaters and hessian bags were stored in the lock up and the first fire tanker, a 1926 Garford, would swing by the pub to pick up fire fighters!

In 1945 a fire station was built in Anzac Parade. Local identity, Stuart Boag, donated all the materials and volunteers erected the building. However, in 1959 the Commissioner of the NSW Fire Brigade commandeered the building. After several moves to backyard sheds, the current Rural Fire Station in Burgess Street was erected in 1979, following impressive fundraising by the Brigade Auxiliary. All further additions to the building have been paid for by fundraising and donations – a wonderful accomplishment by a very generous community.

The Brigade has grown over the years – we now have 22 active fire fighters, 15 Juniors and 16 Auxiliary members. RFS has three vehicles – a large tanker (Cat 1), a smaller utility type (Cat 9) and a 5-seater personnel carrier (PC).

We have a good rapport with Bundanoon's Fire & Rescue Brigade, working closely with them at many incidents.

We are always on the look-out for suitable new members – both male and female!

Garbage collection. There are generally three waste and recycling bins at each property. The yellow-lidded bin is mixed recycling, the green-lidded bin is garden organics. These bins are emptied on alternate weeks. The red-lidded bin is general waste. Red-lidded bins are collected weekly (green body) and fortnightly with the yellow bin (black body). 



Bundanoon has a beautiful railway station that recently celebrated its 150th anniversary. We are on the main southern line with plenty to see (and hear!) for train enthusiasts.



We get two services into Sydney in the morning and two returning each afternoon/evening on the Sydney Trains (Opal card) services. These are unbooked. More regular services to and from Sydney run from Moss Vale. Seniors with a gold Opal card can travel anywhere on the Sydney Trains network, as well as ferries, buses and trams for \$2.50 per day.

We also have the NSW Trainlink service that provide three services each way between Bundanoon and Sydney as well as Bundanoon and Canberra. These are booked services that stop on demand and have a buffet service on board.



Bundanoon Discovery Rambles

All walks start and finish at the railway station. Please keep to paths and respect private property. Please take your litter home and keep your dog under control. Carry water on longer walks; a bubbler is available at the bus shelter near the station.

Please use these notes in conjunction with the map downloadable from www.bundanoon.nsw.au.

Oval Walk

Time: 25 minutes. Grade: easy.

Cross the railway line and cross Erith St to Ellsmore Rd. Follow Ellsmore Rd until you see Jordans Crossing Park on your right. Take the walking path past the Oval, where there is an excellent range of children's play equipment, and turn right into Erith St. After a short distance, turn right onto a cycleway and continue to Ellsmore Rd. Turn left to return to the station.

Grey Gum Walk

Time: 30-45 minutes. Grade: easy.

Walk straight ahead from the station into Church St. Go past the Post Office and turn right into The Gullies Rd (opposite school), where satin bowerbirds can often be spotted. Turn right into Grey Gum Lane and right at the end into Penrose Rd. Follow Penrose Rd and at the end, turn right into Anzac Pde. Turn left at the end to return to the station.

Links Circuit

Fime: 45 minutes. Grade: easy.

Cross the railway line and turn left into Erith St. Continue past the Bundanoon Hotel and at the Hill St roundabout head straight ahead into Bromhall Rd. This area used to be a golf course and kangaroos can often be seen grazing. Turn right into Forwood Cres then right into Penola St. At the end of Penola St, take a track between houses (to the right of number 14) and go up a bank into Old Wingello Rd. Turn right and after a short distance take a grass path on your left leading into Bundanoon Cemetery. After a look at the graves, return to Old Wingello Rd, turn left and continue to Ellsmore Rd, where you turn right to return to the station.

Governors Walk

Time: 45 minutes. Grade: medium. NB: track can be boggy.

Walk straight ahead from the station into Church St. Go past the Post Office and down Constitution Hill. Turn left into Governors St and pass Jackmans Cottage, which dates from the early 1880s and is one of the oldest residential properties in Bundanoon. At the end of the roadway, head towards the fence on your right and follow a bush track that meanders through woodland (look for yellow marks on trees and posts). You'll often see mobs of kangaroos. Shortly after the track narrows then bears to the left, clamber through a wire fence to a driveway that leads past a water pumping station and into Panorama Rd and turn left into Viewland St, then left into Amos Lane, then left into Railway Ave and back to the station.

Quarry Road Circuit

Fime: 11/4 hours. Grade: easy.

Cross the railway line and turn left into Erith St. Continue past the Bundanoon Hotel and at the Hill St roundabout head straight ahead into Bromhall Rd. Continue along Bromhall Rd into Penola St and at the end of Penola St, take a track between houses (to the right of number 14) and go up a bank into Old Wingello Rd. Turn left and then left again into Quarry Rd. Birdwatchers may want to pause here to view the abundant waterbirds usually in residence on the ponds attached to the sewage works. Continue along Quarry Rd, crossing the railway bridge, and turn left into Penrose Rd. Then turn right into Willis St, left into Ross St and right into Penrose Rd again. At the end, turn right into Anzac Pde, then turn left to return to the station.

Blue Gum

Time: 11/2-2hours. Grade: easy.

Cross the railway line and turn right along Erith St, past the former homes of some of Bundanoon's pioneer settlers. Continue past Bundanoon Oval and swimming pool until just before a railway bridge. Turn left into the driveway of Corinda Grange (there is a right of way on the left-hand side). Just before the property entrance, turn left onto a path through the bushes, which joins Blue Gum Rd. Continue along Blue Gum Rd, where you'll often see kangaroos, and turn left into Lynne Cl. At the end, take the path between houses to Lorna Cl. [Birdwatchers may want to detour to Currabunda Wetlands, where a variety of waterbirds can be seen, by turning right and walking along Lorna Cl and across Ellsmore Road, before retracing their steps along Lorna Cl.] Almost directly opposite, take a path down to Jordans Crossing Park. Cross the park and take a path between houses to Bindar Cres. Turn left and follow Bindar Cres to Ellsmore Rd. Turn left to return to the station.

Lower Gullies

Fime: 1½ hours. Grade: medium.

Walk straight ahead from the station into Church St. Go past the Post Office and down Constitution Hill towards Morton National Park. Turn right into Lower Gullies Rd, then right onto a fire trail through attractive bushland. At the end of the trail there is a locked gate. Retrace your steps back to The Gullies Rd, turn left, and then turn left again into the unmade section of The Gullies Rd. At the top, turn left into Church St and return to the station.

A Taste of Morton

Time: 1%-2 hours. Grade: medium. NB: No dogs allowed as part of the track is through Morton National Park.

Walk straight ahead from the station into Church St. Go past the Post Office and down Constitution Hill towards Morton National Park. Turn left into Riverview Rd and follow the road past the first Morton National Park entrance sign to Dimmocks Creek car park. Turn left along a track signposted to Glow Worm Glen. Head through wooded bushland, where lyrebirds and a number of smaller birds may be spotted, and at the T junction, turn left into a track that leads to William St (or turn right for an optional detour to Glow Worm Glen, bearing in mind that the glow worms are visible only after dark). Head down William St until it reaches Railway Ave, then turn left to return to the station.
